Over the last ten years, we have had external support from the National Science Foundation for the Mid-Atlantic Center for Mathematics Teaching and Learning to provide fellowships to almost thirty doctoral students at the University of Maryland over the last six years.

In addition to our ongoing academic mission as a unit in EDCI, we are involved in:

- Outreach to local districts,
- Research on mathematics instruction in urban schools,
- And Dialogue with policymakers and practitioners.
