Doctoral Program in Learning Disabilities Grant Funding Available

How can we give struggling readers opportunities to think, read, and write critically in history and social studies classrooms?

Dr. Susan De La Paz has been awarded a three-year, federally funded research grant that specifically targets disciplinary literacy with struggling readers in the Prince George's County Public School System.

This award makes it possible for one strong individual to receive funding for Doctoral study – one teacher will receive three years of tuition and stipend

Applicants with experience in teaching American history or social studies at the middle or high school level, as well as those who are interested in being part of a strong research team are especially encouraged to apply.
